**GSC Salem Mission**

Good Shepherd Convent in Salem District is a Non-Governmental and Community-Based Organization working for the empowerment of children and women from the most disadvantaged communities of Ayodhiyapattanam Block for the past 22 years. We are reaching out to the marginalized, especially the needy and the poor children through Educational and Community Sponsorship Programme, Supplementary Education for the children of Non-literate Parents, Vocational Training for young women and dropout children, Promoting Indian System of Medicines (ISM), Interfaith Peacebuilding Initiatives and Creating Safe Space for Vulnerable Children who are in need of Care, Protection and Development and also through various social awareness programs for the welfare of children and women from the deprived sections of the society.

## Vikaasine (Project - 1)

The programme Vikaasine (girl child) focuses on the empowerment of children and women from the most disadvantaged communities of Ayodhiyapattanam Block through Supplementary Education for the children of non-literate parents and Vocational Training (Tailoring) for young women. There are six (6) Supplementary Education Centres running in the most marginalised communities of the Ayodhiyapattanam block, Salem. It focuses on uplifting the children and women from breaking their chain of school drop-out, child labour, child marriage and various forms of child abuses through various sensitisation and skill training programmes and campaigns.

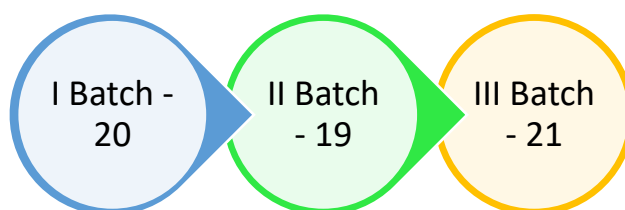

Supplementary Education Centres has the special focus on creating platforms to make aware of child rights, safeguarding children from all kinds of abuses and to ensure them continue mainstream education through various sensitisation and joint initiatives. This mission aims at creating communities without school dropouts, child marriage, child labour and children to be free from all forms of abuses. It mainly emphasis on creating a child friendly village without any discrimination practices and space to raise their voice.

### Tailoring Centre

Good Shepherd Sisters and Partner-in-Mission with much difficulty set-up a tailoring centre in the Pallipatti village in the panchayat space provided by the elected representatives and Government Officials for the disadvantage women in the locality. Two batches of women (40) of them were completed the short-term tailoring and dress-making course and got the certificate. Two Batch tailoring students came together for the award giving programme and got insights about the business ideas from the entrepreneur who came as a resource person for the ceremony. The new batch started with the 21 women from the neighbouring villages and deprived sections in the community.



## **Major Events**

### **Observation of Mother Earth Day (Sr. Aguchita)**

The Partners-in-Mission along with Sisters after being inspired by the life of Sr. Aguchita, planned and observed the day at the community level. The observation started with a short orientation about the mission undertaken by Sr. Aguchita in the perspective of ecological concern. We also had short sharing among the staff on the following questions: 1. Are we eco-friendly persons? and 2. Are we promoting the eco-concerned activities to the people in the communities where we are working? Finally, we decided to have some initiatives as Partners in Mission on that day: 1. Released a small flyer regarding the Mother-Earth Day in remembrance of Sr. Aguchita, 2. All the Partners in Mission together contributed and planted the sapling in the Good Shepherd Campus and named it as Sr. Aguchita garden and 3. Took oath to promote eco-concerned activities.

### **Celebration of Good Shepherd Sisters Arrival in India on 14 August 1854**

As a remembrance of the Sisters coming to India on 14 August 1854, the Partners-in-Mission organized 3 cluster-level celebration with the children, parents and local leaders. The celebration included songs, skit, drawing and speech competition about the works of Good Shepherd Sisters. The children shared about the works of sisters in their own unique way and also expressed their gratitude on the impact the sisters made in the minds of the children and community members. Children expressed their gratitude for organising Supplementary Education Centres which was beyond their dreams, but now we are enjoying the education and also the sponsorship programme they said. The also shared about the meaningful awareness programs organised periodically by the sisters through various project such as Interfaith Peace Initiatives and Child Rights Project. Finally, the programme was concluded by the cake cutting of cake by the children and local leaders and remembered the good works done by the sisters.

### **Sharing / Reflection with the Staff Team**

Every topic shared in the Partners in Mission online meetings were shared and reflected together during the staff gathering every month. The last sharing was on 'Hospitality', how we should welcome everybody both physically and mentally and had a personal reflection and sharing on how we were practicing and what are some challenges and gaps when we failed to be hospitable like losing one's temper in meeting people. The Staff felt that this kind of reflection time enriches the spirit and enlightens and gives them the strength to learn from the mistakes and move forward with the positive note.

### **Celebration of Partners in Mission Day**

On 4<sup>th</sup> afternoon the celebration began with a prayer song about asking for opportunity to be at peace with everybody. Then the importance of the day was explained by Sr. Aruna George in a brief and beautiful words from the life of Count de Neuville, Madame D'Andigné (First Partners in Mission). Two of them sacrificed their whole life as Partners in Mission and

extended their support for the mission of Good Shepherd congregation. Sister shared the purpose and call of Partners in Mission in the Good Shepherd Mission. Then she also mentioned the purpose of the day and the celebration is to appreciate and acknowledge the contribution made by every Partner in Mission towards Good Shepherd Mission. Good Shepherd Sisters and Partners in Mission join hands to uphold the Good Shepherd Mission with responsibility and work together for the benefits of the people in the communities. She finally thanked all the staff for the hard work and commitment towards the mission moving forward with lots of struggles.

### **World Day Against Trafficking in Person**

World Day Against Human Trafficking in Person observed on 29.07.2022 at Government High School, Karipatti Village Panchayat. In preparation to observe the day in a valuable way the Staffs from our Good Shepherd Convent conducted various competitions for the students. Theme for the competition was “Use and Abuse of Technologies”.

### **International Girl Child Day**

Vikaasine and the Child Rights project together organized the 6 days mass awareness in both institutions and communities started with the poster release on “Apps and Toll-free number which helps to protect the children when they are in emergency” These six days of Campaign have reached around 1500 children and their family members and motivates the duty bearers about the rights of children and this event created platforms to interface meet with children and Village Level Child Protection Committee members.

### **Reflection on Integrated Ecology on November 15<sup>th</sup> (UN climate change conference)**

Good Shepherd Sisters and Partner-in-Mission gathering and took the oath on the theme “Take of your shoes of consumerism and preserve nature” after getting the reflection from Sr. Aruna George on how globally UN climate change conference is focusing on and what are all the necessary steps that we as an individual to take forward in build a environment where everyone respect and preserve nature. Every individual should have the taught not to harm nature by any means and reduce the energy which affects nature and utilizing the resources efficiently and also looking forward for the alternative energies that never harm Eco-system.

### **Elimination of Violence against Women (Orange Day) & Human Rights Day (16 days of Activism)**

In Ayodhyapattinam Block Good Shepherd Convent and Salem District Child Protection Unit jointly observed the 75th anniversary of the International Declaration of Human Rights, Day Against Violence Against Women and Girl Child today. The special guests were Mrs. Thayalanaiki Sub-Superintendent of Police (Rural Sub Division), Ms. Uma Maheshwari, Salem District Child Protection Officer, Aruthashori. Aruna George, Project Director Nallayan Kannier Illam, Mr. Indrajith, Child Protection Officer (Institutions), Panchayat Council Leaders and Government officials in Ayodhyapattinam Union participated and created awareness about women's rights, laws and the status of women in today's society. Officers, Workers and women tied orange ribbons on their hands and chanted slogans like "Respect women's rights" and distributed pamphlets among the public to create awareness. Deputy

Superintendent of Police Mrs. Under the leadership of Thaiyal Naiyaki, they took the pledge emphasizing the central idea that "Women's rights are human rights". More than 100 women from panchayats in Ayodhyapattinam union participated in this event and created awareness among more than 1000 public.

### **Christmas Celebration**

Good Shepherd Sisters and Partners-in-Mission (25) together celebrated Christmas on 19<sup>th</sup> December 2021. It was a beautiful day with much reflection and sharing our thoughts on "Good Shepherd Mission"; both in international and national level programmes, each staff with their excellent testimonies shared their experience of their own personal and professional life. It was followed by fun games and activities which enriched the bonding and relationship between the Sisters and Partners in Mission. At the end of the celebration the Christmas Angels exchanged gifts with innovative approaches and had a wonderful time and meal together. The event came to an end with the positive note of encouragement to move forward with the Good Shepherd Blessing and relationship between staffs.

### **Training to Staffs on M&E framework and Child safeguarding**

Mr. John Aruldhass, consultant, GSC, Salem has provided training to the staff team on M&E framework and child safeguarding policy. With the Simple examples he has taken the training session that everyone can understand in a better way. M&E means monitoring the process of work with various tools and methods to measure the path. Finally, he made all the project team to work on the M&E format project-wise.

### **Staff Excursion**

Good Shepherd Convent sisters and staff planned together and organized a one-day staff tour to the hill station "Kolli Hills" in Nammakkal district. ## Safe Space Created for Vulnerable Children in Need of Care, Protection and Development (Project - 2)

Child Rights Mission focuses on the promotion of the Rights of Children in schools and communities. This initiative is reaching to the community through various forms of awareness programs such as Children's Parliament, Adolescent Girls Groups and Adolescent Boys Groups for Life Skills Education and Supplementary Education Centres. This child rights mission focuses on the reduction of dropouts, Child Marriage, Child Labour and Safeguarding children from all forms of abuses through periodical awareness with the students and parents in the village community.

### Supplementary Education

Our supplementary centers are the multidisciplinary and multidimensional centers. Where the children's studying from 1st standard to above higher studies could develop interest in Education and day by day it also reduces the drop out from the schools and vocational centers



and increase their interest on Education. Our supplementary Education Centers run among the most backward community's children in our working area of Ayothiyapattinam block.

### Children's Parliament:

Children's Parliament has its members from the children who are studying from 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> standard. In this the members learn to adjust to one another and discuss their own problems in transforming their own villages to child friendly villages.

### Adolescent Groups:

One of the key predictors of a successful adolescence is having an adult mentor to talk with. This relationship may not be possible between parent and child. The main objective of our work is to address the felt needs of adolescents and try to resolve through constructive strategies and activities. In this regard to initiate among the adolescents we have conducted and started forming the adolescent groups in 9 villages out of 20 working villages. These adolescent girls and boys have felt the real need of Education and life skills. When both Education and Life Skills go together, they lead them to the destiny of their life.

### Important Days and Campaigns conducted to protect and promote the child rights:

- ❖ **International day against Drug Abuse and Illicit trafficking** was observed through Drawing and Speech competitions for the government school children's in Karipatti Panchayat on 26 of June 2022.
- ❖ **International Day of Girl child** was observed along with the District Child Protection Unit of Salem in Udaiyapatti Government High School. On that day the poster, which contains the Toll-free and the important apps that are in the smart phones was released by Mr.Elangovan, Block Development Officer, Ayothiyapattinam and Sr.Aruna George,

Program Director, Good Shepherd Convent, Salem and Miss. Lavanya Grace, State Child Protection Officer (Gender), Tamilnadu on 11 of October 2022.

- ❖ **Child Rights Week** was celebrated with the parents of our supplementary education centres students from 14 to 19<sup>th</sup> of November 2022.
- ❖ **Children's Day** celebration was held on 20<sup>th</sup> of November 2022 with the participation of 300 children's from the 11 villages of Ayothiyapattinam Block, Salem District.
- ❖ **Human Rights Day** was observed along with the District Child Protection Unit on 10<sup>th</sup> of December 2022.
- ❖ **National day of the Girl Child and Republic Day:** A Mini-Marathon was held on 27<sup>th</sup> January 2023 for the students from the Government and Government aided school background on the theme of "Save & Respect Girl Children". Around 460 students and parents were participated in the conclusion public event held in St. Mary school open auditorium by the oration from the Government women officials and Elected women representatives.
- ❖ **Village Level Child Protection Committees** were formed in 16 village Panchayats of Ayothiyapattinam Block

**"I am an Illiterate, but I would not allow my Grandchildren Turnout to be non-literates"**

I am Mrs. shanthi, Grand parent of Master. Guru. He is the son of my daughter who goes for daily wages. I am the care taker of these children. Our family is the big family. My daughter has 6 children and 3 of them are eligible to go to school but they never gone to school. Because we are migrant workers. We never stay in one place. When I was a child, I want to go to school

but that went as a dream. When my grandson was at the age of 5, I want to join him in the school but I had no address proofs. They also rejected us because we are migrant workers. I tried my level best to join him but I could not. At last, I made up mind that this is my family fate and no one has the luck of going to school. In this situation he also crossed the age of 12 years of his age. When one thinks everything goes wrong but there comes one right like that there comes a god's servants - the Good Shepherd Sisters staffs Mr. Prabhu and Mr. Rajasekar, who came to our doorsteps to help us. First, I was not willing to join because we had enough of struggle and also the age of my grandson was too old. They motivated us and guides to join the school. Now I have joined both of my grandson's 6<sup>th</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> respectively. When I hear from my grandsons that they were enquired by the staffs whenever they come to school for other activities.

I thank the Good Shepherd Sisters and staffs who have taken the pain and the struggle to help us. Now I say to everyone that I may be illiterate but my grandsons are not illiterate. This help even goes beyond my joyful dears when everyday my grandsons wear their school uniform. My thanks and gratitude towards the Good Shepherd Sisters stay till my death.

## Interfaith Peace Initiatives (Project - 3)

### Introduction

Interfaith Peace-Building Initiatives focuses on the increase of knowledge on Conflict Resolution and Management Skills and Promotion of Education on Peace and Social Harmony among Interfaith groups in Ayothiyapattinam Block, Salem District. Especially Peace Mission emphases on dismantling discrimination based on religion, caste and gender.

### Peace Groups

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All these Members from village join together as an interfaith peace committee and were frequently trained on the Conflict analysis & Resolution Skills and peace-building activities / events. They are frequently coming together to have dialogue / Discussion on various village realities which affects the coexistence of the village people peacefully. Special focus on the issues related to caste, religion and gender-based discriminations which directly affects the equality, constitutional and subaltern values. This groups also focuses on interfaith peace and harmony. They are involving in interfaith celebrations and joint action for the common development activities of their respective village.

### Major Events

#### International Day of Peace 2022 Come, let us celebrate the diversity!

On the occasion of the International Day of Peace, 21st September 2022, the Sisters of the Good Shepherd, Salem, Peace Collective [initiated by Sisters of the Good Shepherd], and Salem Social Service Society [SSSS], a social development wing of the Catholic Diocese of Salem, jointly organized an awareness rally and a public meeting in Salem city to strengthen the ideals of peace. The other collaborators of this day were Government Officials, Religious Leaders of different faiths, school and colleges. The day was marked by a Peace Rally from Natanmai Kazhagam to YMCA Hall, Salem and a public meeting for creation of a world where compassion and empathy overcome suspicion and hatred. Mr. J. Prabu and Mr. R. Sam, Project Coordinators of Child Rights Project and Pilot India Interfaith Experience Project respectively of the Good Shepherd Sisters facilitated the rally and the public meeting.

#### Let us celebrate the Diwali with Happiness & without Discrimination

Good Shepherd Convent along with SKS Trust & St. Bonnie White College of Nursing celebrated the Interfaith Diwali in the college premises for the first time in the history of the college. Good Shepherd sisters and staff dialogue with the principal regarding the current scenario of hate speech upon each other through various discrimination and prejudice. In order to dismantle this kind of negative thoughts especially in the mindset of youth we have planned to counteract the scenario by celebrating the Interfaith Diwali Celebration. This Programme

was decorated with the “Rangoli and creative drawing by students on Gender equality. Students with the primary understanding of the discrimination in today’s context and expressed their need in a positive gesture through this is arts to the whole college.

### **Interfaith Champions coming together**

First time all the representatives from different village organized together in the common place to share their feelings and to attend the training on roles and responsibility of interfaith champions. The training started with the common awareness song and soon after the song few participants explained about the theme of the song “Justice Society”.

### **Stakeholder Meet**

Peace Initiatives in collaboration with the District Backward and Minority Department organized a stakeholder meeting for the people & Government Representatives – VAO’s, Panchayat President, Ward members and Secretary from 13 panchayat in Aythiyapattinam Block. The meeting is to orient the sufferings of minorities and their livelihood. First time People & Government representatives came together for the meeting and discussed regarding the rights of the minorities. Everybody felt the need and suffering of the minorities and have assured to take the minority schemes to the needy people in the society. Leaders shared their willingness to support us in all the peace mission activities in the villages.

### **Interfaith Christmas Celebration**

A. N. Mangalam has the history of religious unity between Hindus and Christian, especially during the car procession people from other faith respect and go along with them. The people have mutual respect and they were friendly towards each other in exchange of ideas and hospitality. As the years go now slowly the enmity started to raise between few people influenced by the fundamentalist in the village. It ended in the destruction of harmony between the groups in the village. After the tension still Christians are afraid to follow and practice their faith especially during their festival times. This incident is a scare in the minds of the people. In order to break this enmity and to bring solution between the two faith groups, All the peace group members planned and organized this interfaith Christmas celebration to promote peace and harmony in the village through various forms of folk arts and events.

### **“Amaithi Sangamam Meeting”**

Peace among religions is a precondition for world peace. - Agnivesh ‘AMAITHI SANGAMAM’ (Peace Collective) is a forum of religious leaders who are oriented and committed to work for peace. Though in the past have met few times, this is the first time they have assembled in large numbers; 30 of them came together to share their experiences. It is a history that this is the first time religious of different faith assembled in a mosque premises. It is a great breakthrough which had created positive vibration among everyone and made everyone think of peace as a possible one. This kind of peace initiatives must take shape and strive to create peace and social harmony. The Muslim brothers expressed their gratefulness by their gesture and created a harmony climate for everyone to feel good. It is the hope that this AMAITHI SANGAMAM might continue to function, be a platform and supportive organ to one another and also take steps to resolve conflicts that might occur. May coming together like this, promote interreligious dialogue, mutual respect and cooperation. Religious leaders from

three different faiths came together on 14th December 2022 in a mosque located in Ammapet, Salem. They have been coming together in the past to share their point of views with reference to the ongoing conflicts related to religion and are striving to build interfaith peace.

### **Joint Action**

#### **1. Empowering Communities to understand their Roles and Responsibility**

**Name of the Village:** Poovanoor

**Type of Issue:** Denial of Government scheme to SC/ST community people

**Background of the Issue:** In the poovanoor village different caste people are living and caste people domination are high in the areas.

The present Government has allotted space for the Dalit people for the post of panchayat president, but the post is just the puppet in the hands of the caste people. All the final signature are approved only by the caste people. The members from the peace groups came out with the issues of not getting the Government Scheme - 'Emmasadanku'. Dalit community were not able to access the schemes which was available for them. The panchayat president is also from the Dalit community because of that he was not given much preference in the decision making of the village development. Now the people are aware of their rights and involving in the steps to attain it. Firstly, after the discussion the women gathered and wrote a petition and submitted in the "grama sabha", there were no response and second time the people gathered and gave the petition to the Block development officer, finally he accepted the letter and assured the people that I will release the fund properly for the betterment of the people.

#### **2. Requesting to recruit religious leader from the Dalit community for the common temple in the village**

Sakthi Nagar village has a common "Mariyamman Kovil" at the beginning of the village and all the people in the village has the access to the temple regardless caste. But one the occasion of festivals all the caste people dominated and they won't give space to the Dalit people to participate in the key rituals during the celebration and they don't have the voice to do their wish. So, all the Dalit community united together and asked to make the religious leaders from Dalit community, previous there were religious leaders from three major community like Udhayar, Vaniyar and Boyar. Now Dalit asked to make a leader from our own community so that we can also take part in the decision making and also in the rituals during the celebration and important matters in the village for the development in all perspective of their livelihood.

### **Success Story**

#### **Ripple Effect**

Peace Mission becomes the agenda for the Imman's committee after their frequent participation in the Religious Leaders Meet and Interfaith celebration and common occasions. They had adopted the concept of interfaith coming together in their own "Millathu Festival" by inviting all the people practicing different religions and traditions. They had also made the interfaith women committee meeting in their premises and its meeting is taking place frequently to education the people on interfaith peace and harmony. Salem Rotary and major NGOs in Salem

started to think and replicate the initiatives in their own gatherings. They had felt this peace initiatives in the need of the hour and started to give hands for the extension of the concept in the district level.

## **SOCIO-ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT OF TRIBAL AND DALIT WOMEN** (Project - 4)

Among the vulnerable communities, the most defenceless were the women and children of the SC and ST communities because they economically depend on men of their households. The issues they are facing domestic violence, neglect in decision-making, uncared during illness, starving, unmet basic needs, subjected to risk of various forms of abuses and look-down in the family. These are all the major reason for the Good Shepherd Sisters to reach to this selected communities in the Ayothiyapattinam of the Salem District.

The main objective of this project is to increase the capacity of women to address the livelihood issues by accessing them to financial support from institutions and Government schemes. Facilitating them to increase additional household income, motivating and strengthening their self-confidence, leadership qualities, skills and involvement of women in decision making both in family and community. Also, to improve agricultural practices and use of natural resources leading to increased agricultural yield.

To Promote and strengthen people's institutions and educating them with knowledge and information on government schemes and their rights to entitlements. It will build the capacity and leadership quality among women to access government schemes and financial support from various financial institutions for the development of their communities. Access to resources will improve the confidence among women and enable them to approach the various line departments for the necessary development schemes. To develop the skill for business management and alternative income generation programme with support for initiating small entrepreneurship & Business activities. To develop the skills of women in order to undertake business activities and marketing will help them to initiate small business activities, which will enhance their economic condition. Supporting women with small capitals would help to kick start the business activities, which could be enlarged later as the progress takes place. To develop the leadership skills and awareness on gender equality for men, women and children. It will help to reduce gender gaps and build the leadership capacity of women to venture into public sphere. This will enhance their self-esteem and self-confidence and build a gender sensitive community. Conducting Programme and training for enhancing Agriculture and allied activities for the women because majority of the tribal communities have small pieces of land, but they do not used to modern practices or improved agricultural practices; it is essential to give them training and focus on increasing their agricultural produce.
